The Hull and East Yorkshire Centre for the Deaf.

The charity was established over 100 years ago by a group of Deaf people who met regularly under a street light down High Street in Hull. They met to communicate with each other in their own language as they were, on the whole, sidelined as being different. They later moved to a room in a pub and eventually rented 179 High Street as their first base. From there they have of

MARIE ROUTLEDGE.

This year we lost a great stalwart of the Festival, Marie Routledge, who had been involved with the Festival in one way or another almost from the start over 40 years ago. In the programme for 1982 it said, briefly, "Marie is well known in the area as a piano teacher and accompanist." Singers and Instrumentalists often approach the official accompanist feeling a little nervous as they've been used to singing with a parent or teacher, rarely with a stranger. I remember Marie saying on a number of occasions that quite often the soloist agreed on a speed but once they started, they rarely played or sung at the same speed. Many have benefitted from a few calming words from Marie, from her ability to play at whatever speed they choose, from her sympathetic approach and helpful accompaniment.

Marie also taught piano and singing and brought the Brough Junior Choir to sing at the Festival for a number of years. She also accompanied the Hunsley Singers when we had classes for Adult Choirs.

The Cottingham Methodist Church Musical Festival is organised by a Committee of Church members and friends. The first Festival was held in 1978 as part of the Church Centenary Celebrations and has continued every year, apart from 2020. We joined the British and International Federation of Festivals in, about, 1990 and have used Federation Adjudicators since then. The adjudicators are rigorously trained to use the official descriptors (see page 16) and are monitored regularly. The descriptors are in process of being changed and we could be one of the last Festivals to use the old system. The new system will have 7 levels from Developing (65 to 69) to Exceptional (95+).

OUR ADJUDICATORS

<u>LIBBY BURGESS</u> is well-known as a pianist on concert stages across Britain, playing in the country's major halls and festivals, on Radio 3, and on a range of recordings. Equally respected for her programming and curational skills, she is the founding director of New Paths Music which presents two festivals in Beverley each year, and from 2018 to 2022 was Co-Artistic Director with Martin Roscoe of the Beverley Chamber Music Festival.

Libby is both a song specialist and a chamber musician and she is sought after as a vocal coach: the seeds of her love for working with voices were sown as organ scholar at Christ Church, Oxford, and nurtured in postgraduate piano studies at the Royal Academy of Music. Libby was formerly Head of Keyboard at Eton College, is in demand as a speaker and writer, and loves working in outreach contexts that seek to overcome barriers and share the power of music with everyone.

MARTIN WALLINGTON has recently retired from playing the viola with the BBC Philharmonic, after 36 years in the job. A graduate of Chetham's School of Music and The Royal Northern College of Music, he has enjoyed an exciting and fulfilling career playing in many of the finest concert halls in Europe, North and South America, China and Japan, as well as the BBC Proms and all the major concert venues in the UK.

Martin is hugely committed to his involvement in music education. He regularly advises senior students at the beginning of their professional career, and was for a number of years a Mentor for the BBC Philharmonic/RNCM Professional Access Scheme, where students spend time working alongside their mentor in the professional working environment. He has always had a busy private teaching practice, as well as teaching for a number of years at Manchester University.

Away from music, Martin is a fluent French speaker and loves 'escaping' to France on holiday. A keen walker, he will often be found hiking around the Yorkshire Wolds where he lives with his wife (a cello teacher), 2 huge cats and 2 crazy dogs!

ANGELA ROWLEY is a graduate in German from University College, London and after a period in teaching, began private singing training with, among others, Paul Hamburger, leading to the ARCM and a successful singing career.

Angela has performed throughout the UK and Europe and performs periodically in recital, concert and oratorio. For several years Angela taught singing in a large comprehensive school and later in a Sixth Form College where she formed a choir, assisted in the production of musicals and initiated the development of music in the curriculum for students with both mild and severe learning difficulties.

Angela has a private practice, leads residential workshops and masterclasses and is Musical Director of Eccles Community Choir and co-ordinator and MD of Harmony '96 choir. In 2019 Angela was a finalist in the Francesca Hanley 'Inspirational Teacher of the Year' awards sponsored by the Musicians' Union.

Angela is a fellow of the Incorporated Society of Musicians and an adjudicator with the British and International Federation of Festivals and is happy to adjudicate online festivals.
