

#### **SPECIAL AWARDS presented at the Celebration Concert**

Two trophies are awarded to competitors recognised by the adjudicators as "most promising performers" -

- in the junior age classes the Eardley Kemp Trophy;
- in the senior age classes the Frederick Ingilby Cup.

Victor Ludorum Shields are awarded to the most meritorious performance in each section of the Festival.

The winners of the above trophies also receive a cheque from the Friiends of the Festival to help them in their further studies.

#### **OUR ADJUDICATORS**

Gillian Johnston is a graduate of the Guildhall School of Music and Drama. After a period of freelance playing as a bassoonist, Gill turned her attention to teaching. She built up an enviable instrumental department at Stratford House School in Bromley and started to organise holiday courses for the players. With her husband David, then Head of Woodwind for the London Borough of Barnet, she created Harpenden Musicale (www.musicale.co.uk), now probably the country's largest private community music centre with over 1000 pupils a week ranging from Monkey Music for babies to enthusiastic pupils well past retirement age. Musicale also embraces 'Musicale Holidays' and has a fully stocked music shop, specialising in the education market. Gill is co-founder of the National Children's Wind and Chamber Orchestras (www.ncwo.org.uk), running courses every Easter at Queenswood School in Hertfordshire, followed by concerts at home and abroad. Gill is passionately interested in encouraging children to 'make music' and thoroughly enjoys adjudicating at festivals all over the country.

Gaynor Keeble gained scholarships to the University of Warwick and the Royal Academy of Music. She combines a busy performing career with teaching both privately and at Warwick University & adjudicating at many festivals. She has also worked extensively with English Touring Opera's Education Programme. She was a member of Welsh National Opera and has worked for the Royal Opera, English National Opera, Opera North, D'Oyly Carte Mid- Wales and English Touring Opera Carl Rosa.

She maintains a busy operatic career with recent engagements including Katisha (ENO), 3<sup>rd</sup> Lady Magic Flute & Voice of the Mother (Hoffmann) Royal Opera House, Hippolyta (Midsummer Nights Dream) & Gertrude (Romeo & Juliet) both for Opera. Roles in 2011 include 3<sup>rd</sup> Lady (ROH), La Marquise (Fille du Regiment), Mistress Quickly (Falstaff) Longborough & Annina (La Traviata) ROH.

<u>Marilynne Davies</u> has developed a lifelong passion and enthusiasm for all aspects of performance from her early experiences of performing in Welsh Eisteddfodau. Having studied piano, voice and cello at the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama she took a Masters Degree in Education. The combination of these two strands consolidated her interest in Music Performance and Music Education and the interface between the two. Her appointment as Head of the School of Performance at the College of Ripon and York St. John enabled her to maintain and develop these interests nationally and internationally. She was a founder member of Polyphonia - a network of European Conservatoires – and has lectured and conducted workshops in a number of countries.

As an adjudicator member of the British and International Federation of Festivals she is well established and has adjudicated nationally and internationally. In 2003 and 2005 she adjudicated at the National Sri Lankan Festival. She has been a regular adjudicator at Music for Youth on the South Bank and at Birmingham. She adjudicated at the British Federation Festival of Festivals in Warwick and was one of the presenters at the Millennium Festival in Leeds. She is also involved in the selection of potential new adjudicators.

<u>Elizabeth Childs</u> is a graduate of the Royal Academy of Music. Whilst at the RAM she performed regularly with all the orchestras, and was also engaged in many internal and external teaching projects. She has performed extensively throughout the UK as soloist, recitalist and orchestral player and international engagements have taken her to the USA and many parts of Europe. From 1987 to 1994, Elizabeth was principal flute with the Sinfonia of Scotland, Dundee Opera and Dundee and Perth Light Operatic Company which complemented her work for both 'Travel Scotland' and a busy teaching schedule.

Elizabeth has a broad and extensive teaching career and is in demand as a flute tutor. It is a mission of hers to encourage as many children as possible to have the experience of taking part in a Federation Festival. Currently she is engaged in a busy teaching schedule which includes Wells Cathedral School, UEA in Norwich, is Flautist in Quintessimo, plays with the Aurelian Ensemble and is part of the management team for Harpenden Musicale as well as directing several successful flute choirs. One of her main aims is to provide as many performing opportunities for all her pupils as possible and firmly believes that encouraging children to perform enhances and benefits all areas of their education. Elizabeth is on the Board of the British and International Federation of Festivals and is Chair to the Adjudicators Council.

<u>Margaret Venables</u> had been entering festivals from the age of seven and at seventeen, she gained a place at the Royal Academy of Music, with Piano and Organ as her first study, and the 'cello as her second instrument.

During a varied teaching career following her Conservatory training, she became Head of Music at Danum Grammar School. Her out of school interests included broadcasting with William Appleby's Singing Together whose choir also sang evensong in Ely cathedral during annual cathedral choir holidays.

Margaret travelled widely in Europe and America conducting the Scout and Guide Symphony Orchestra and broadcast with them on television in England. In this capacity she composed for and conducted Scout and Guide choirs for many years in Westminster Abbey, at the annual Thinking Day service, and led annual Guide carol singing in an invariably freezing Trafalgar Square.

Academically, she was a member of various national committees of the Schools Council for nine years and also the NUM Examinations Committee. Margaret also chairs a Music and Drama Festival in her local area, and she was extremely proud to have been elected as the first woman Chairman in the Federations history at the 2005 Conference. In this capacity she continues to head the Board of Trustees.
