


OUR ADJUDICATORS

CHRISTINA THOMSON attended the Royal Academy of Music after leaving the National Youth Orchestra. A fascinating career as a horn player in Germany followed. She then returned to London in 1984 to perform chamber music, became a soloist with several chamber orchestras and taught at Harrow and the Purcell School. In 1991 she returned to her home town of Ripon where she teaches at the Ripon Choir School, Ampleforth College and Hurworth House School as well as having an extensive private teaching practice, encompassing ages from 5 to 70.

After she was robbed of her embouchure in an incident in 2000 she retired from professional playing and now concentrates on pedagogy. She is internationally in demand as an adjudicator, and examines for the Associated Board in England and abroad, as well as being Brass Specialist Mentor for the Board's Professional Development Course.

Christina enjoys cycling and high-level mountain walking in the Austrian Alps as an antidote to the hectic musical life she leads.

STEVEN ROBERTS has combined a career in education with his work as a conductor, musical director and adjudicator, working both in this country and in Europe and as far afield as Peru and Bahrain. His work in education has included training musicians and actors and has worked extensively with partner schools as part of his past educational responsibilities.

Despite a very busy educational career Steven has conducted numerous groups, including the Liverpool Welsh Choral Union, The Huddersfield Choral Society, Dodworth and Skelmanthorpe Male Voice Choirs and a variety of orchestras, brass bands and wind ensembles, as well as being Chorus Master for concerts with Dame Kiri Te Kanawa and Jose Carreras. He is currently Musical Director and Conductor with the Altrincham Choral Society, and the Chesterfield Philharmonic Choir and has also worked as musical director for a number of theatrical productions, and this diversity reflects his music and drama training.

Steven is Music Director with Sing Live UK which has seen him conduct in numerous concert halls, including the Royal Albert Hall, as well as conducting in the College Gardens of Westminster Abbey for The Lady Taverners and at Mass in St Peter's Basilica, Vatican City, St Mark's Basilica in Venice and in Assisi and most recently in Vienna, Salzburg, Amalfi, Milan and Paris. He has conducted numerous concerts throughout this country, in Germany, France, Italy and the Czech Republic and with a variety of Choirs, ensembles and orchestras.

Steven is an adjudicator member of the British and International Federation of Festivals, and a member of the Board of Trustees; he also acts as a Music Mentor for Music for Youth and is a member of the Association of British Choral Directors. He is a member of The Lord's Taverners, the cricketing charity that raises money to give 'young people, particularly with special needs a sporting chance'.

VIVIEN PIKE studied music at the Royal Manchester/Royal Northern College of Music after previously studying medical sciences. She graduated with teaching and performing diplomas and a silver medal.

Vivien has wide experience as a recitalist and soprano soloist with many choral societies. She has sung in choirs from the age of 7 and is a former member of the BBC Northern Singers. She is vocal coach for several choral societies.

Over the years as a peripatetic teacher of singing in Yorkshire, she has taught hundreds of young singers, one of the first being Lesley Garrett. Her choirs have won many prizes in national and international competitions and have enjoyed tours to Italy, Germany, Ireland, Australia (representing UK at the first Melbourne International Choral Festival), Canada and USA, Finland and Estonia. Her female choir celebrated 30 years of high standard singing in 2009.

Vivien is in great demand for solo singing and choral workshops and has worked with singers in Sweden, Latvia, Ireland, New Zealand and Estonia. She has lectured in Latvia and Slovenia and recently as a visiting professor at the Estonian Academy of Music. Her international jury work

includes the World Choir Games in Linz and Graz, festivals in Malta, Italy, Germany, Ireland, Jersey and is currently the UK representative on the World Choir Council. She is an external examiner of singing at degree level and a visiting lecturer/examiner in choral conducting at Huddersfield University. She was awarded an Honorary Doctorate by Sheffield Hallam University in 2006 for her work with singers nationally and internationally and is a Churchill Fellow, researching the Cultural Influences on Voice Development in Sweden, Finland and Estonia. She has recently been elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts.

TROPHY RETURN – All Trophies from the 2012 Festival must be returned to one of the Trophy Secretaries on Saturday 5th or Sunday 6th January 2013 – or earlier, by arrangement. Please ensure all trophies are in good condition and any damage has been repaired. Your cooperation is vital.

<u>TROPHIES</u> are awarded in certain classes and are held by the winners for one year. They must be returned to the Trophy Secretaries by the date requested. Trophies are the responsibility of the winner during that time, and any damage incurred should be repaired at their expense. The cost of engraving (if required) is also the responsibility of the holder. Trophies will only be awarded where the recipient is in one of the top 3 categories.

musician in the three music sections for
competitors in the Junior and Senior age
classes respectively. The winners will each

VICTOR LUDORUM SHIELDS: Special awards are made for the most meritorious performance in each section of the Festival and are presented at the discretion of the Festival Committee and Adjudicators. These awards are presented at the Festival Celebration Concert. The winners will each receive a cheque from the Friends of the Festival to help them in their studies.

RULES

The following rules, which will be strictly adhered to, have been drawn up to facilitate the smooth running of the Festival and provide fair competition. All competitors, parents and teachers are strongly advised to read them before completing the entry form.

1. ENTRIES: All entries must be on the official entry forms and accompanied by the correct entry fee. Incomplete entry forms will be returned for amendment before being accepted. All forms must be accompanied by a

CORRECTLY STAMPED ADDRESSED ENVELOPE OF AT LEAST A5 SIZE.

Monday 25th October 2012

Except for

Adult Choir Classes 1st March 2013

Fees are shown for each class within the syllabus. Cheques should be made payable to "CMCMF".

- 2. ENTRANTS may perform once only in each class, except where they are a bona fide member of two choirs or groups. They may only perform any test piece once in any year's festival.
- 3. AGES: Competitors should calculate their age as at January 15th 2013.

- 4. GRADES: Where classes are restricted by grades then the grade entered at should be that attained at the date of entry.
- 5. MUSIC: Titles of own choice pieces must be clearly written on the entry card and handed in at the Door Steward's Table at least 15 minutes before the start of the class. Copies of own choice music must be supplied for the adjudicator on the day of the Festival and should be clearly marked with competitor's name, class and ballot number.
- 6. ACCOMPANISTS: Competitors are advised to bring their own accompanist if at all possible especially if they choose complicated pieces of music music not only difficult for the soloist and/or the accompanist, but challenging for the integration of the two, where they need to be able to rehearse thoroughly with their own accompanist. Festival's accompanists may allow rehearsals (at a fee). No guarantee can be given and depends if the accompanist has the time available. /Cont over

OWN CHOICE MUSIC for the accompanist and any request to be put in touch with the accompanist must be in the hands of the *Treasurer* by Saturday 8th DECEMBER 2012.

Music should be clearly marked with the competitor's name, class and number, and any musical markings made clear, especially speed. Photocopies may be sent to the accompanists for practice but they must be provided with an original for them to play from in the competition. If you ask to use the official accompanist then you must do so or risk disqualification.

7. AWARDS: In competitive classes, 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place certificates will be awarded to the winners. All competitors will receive an adjudication. Awards will be withheld if, in the opinion of the adjudicator, the standard of performance is not high enough.

TROPHIES WILL ONLY BE AWARDED WHERE THE RECIPIENT IS IN ONE OF THE TOP 3 CATEGORIES.

The adjudicator's decision is final.

8. RECORDING & PHOTOGRAPHY:

The Festival is bound by copyright law and licensing of performances, hence, during performance or adjudication, the taking of Photographs and Video or Tape Recording is not allowed.

9. PRACTICE: A room is available for instrumentalists and singers to warm up their instruments or voices prior to their class. These rooms may only be used if booked in advance through the General Secretary. Entry to practice rooms will NOT be possible until the time booked.

Rooms for choirs to meet in are available by contacting the General Secretary. It must be understood that this is not for full scale practising. It is regretted that practice in the Church cannot be arranged with the exception of Organists accompanying Choirs.

10. TIME: In the own choice classes, time limits will be strictly adhered to. Competitors <u>must note</u>

that their performance may be stopped if they exceed the limit and they may not be given a mark, only an adjudication.

11. DUET & TRIO PARTNERS: If one partner is unable to compete due to illness or accident, a substitute partner may play or sing, provided that the General Secretary has notice of this, at the latest, the day <u>before</u> the class is due to take place. We trust competitors and teachers not to take advantage of this rule simply because one partner has not had time to learn the piece, or obtain music in time.

12. ALTERATIONS & CANCELLATIONS:

The organisers reserve the right to cancel any classes which have too few entries, or to re-time any classes or make any alteration as may be necessary for the smooth running of the Festival. In the event of an adjudicator being unavailable the organisers will appoint an accredited substitute. Some classes with a small number of entries may be grouped together with the adjudication at the end of several classes. Where there is only one competitor in any class the organisers may give them the chance to withdraw and receive a refund of the entry fee. Where most of the competitors are present classes may start earlier than published.

13. PHOTOCOPYING OF MUSIC:

- (a) Photocopying of sheet music is illegal unless you have written permission from the publisher. Competitors must not play from photocopies of sheet music nor should they be given to the adjudicator or the accompanist.
- (b) In Own Choice Classes where publishers are members of The Music Publishers' Association the following applies: "When an own choice work is selected from a publication containing several different works and which is not published separately, one copy may be made for the use of an adjudicator at a competition or festival provided that the competitor or participant has already purchased their own copy and that the photocopy is retained and destroyed by the Administrator of the Competition or Festival immediately after the event. This permission specifically does not apply to set works."

If you are in any doubt please contact The Music Publishers Association at 103 Kingsway, London WC2B 6QX. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure compliance with these rules.

Any photocopy presented which does not conform to these rules will not be accepted and competitors will be disqualified. Competitors finding difficulty in obtaining extra copies should apply to the publishers who are usually very sympathetic in granting permission to copy for a

small fee. In this case a letter of authority is given and the Festival will accept this.

14. PROFESSIONAL STATUS:

No individual entry will be accepted from anyone whose living, wholly or mainly, is derived from performing professionally in the category of the specified class. This does not apply to accompanists or conductors nor to bona fide members of choirs.

SINGING AND CHORAL CLASSES

Competitors are reminded that if they require the services of the official accompanist this should be clearly marked on the entry form. *Please check compliance with rules*, especially 6 and 13.
